Playing Tips

Hole 1: Slight dogleg left. Play tee ball between the hill and the tree on the left. The flag you see from the tee is not the No.1 green. The green rolls from left to right.

Hole 2: Keep your tee shot near the bottom of the hill on the right to avoid the creek on the left. Avoid missing the green to the left. The green rolls from right to left.

Hole 3: Slight dogleg left. Consider hitting a fairway wood off the tee as this hole demands accuracy.

Hole 4: An uphill straight par 3. Club selection is key, because the green is not very deep. Consider adding one club for uphill incline. A bunker protects the right front of the green.

Hole 5: A dogleg right. Safe play is straight with a fairway wood or long iron. Long hitters can drive their ball over the trees, but a bunker protects the front of the green.

Hole 6: Keep your tee ball near the cart path. Tee ball tends to roll left toward the hazard. Second shot must avoid left rough. Hole doglegs left on 2nd or 3rd shot, depending on length. A shot into the green long or right will put you in the rough or the woods.

Hole 7: Uphill dogleg right. A cut shot of the tee works well here. Avoid left rough and the woods on the right off the tee. The steep incline to the green may be a one to two club difference.

Hole 8: Downhill par 3 with a small green that has few straight putts. Avoid a tee shot to the right or you'll be in the bunker or trees.

Hole 9: A straight tee shot with a green sloping back to front makes this hole a good birdie opportunity. Avoid the left side bunker.
